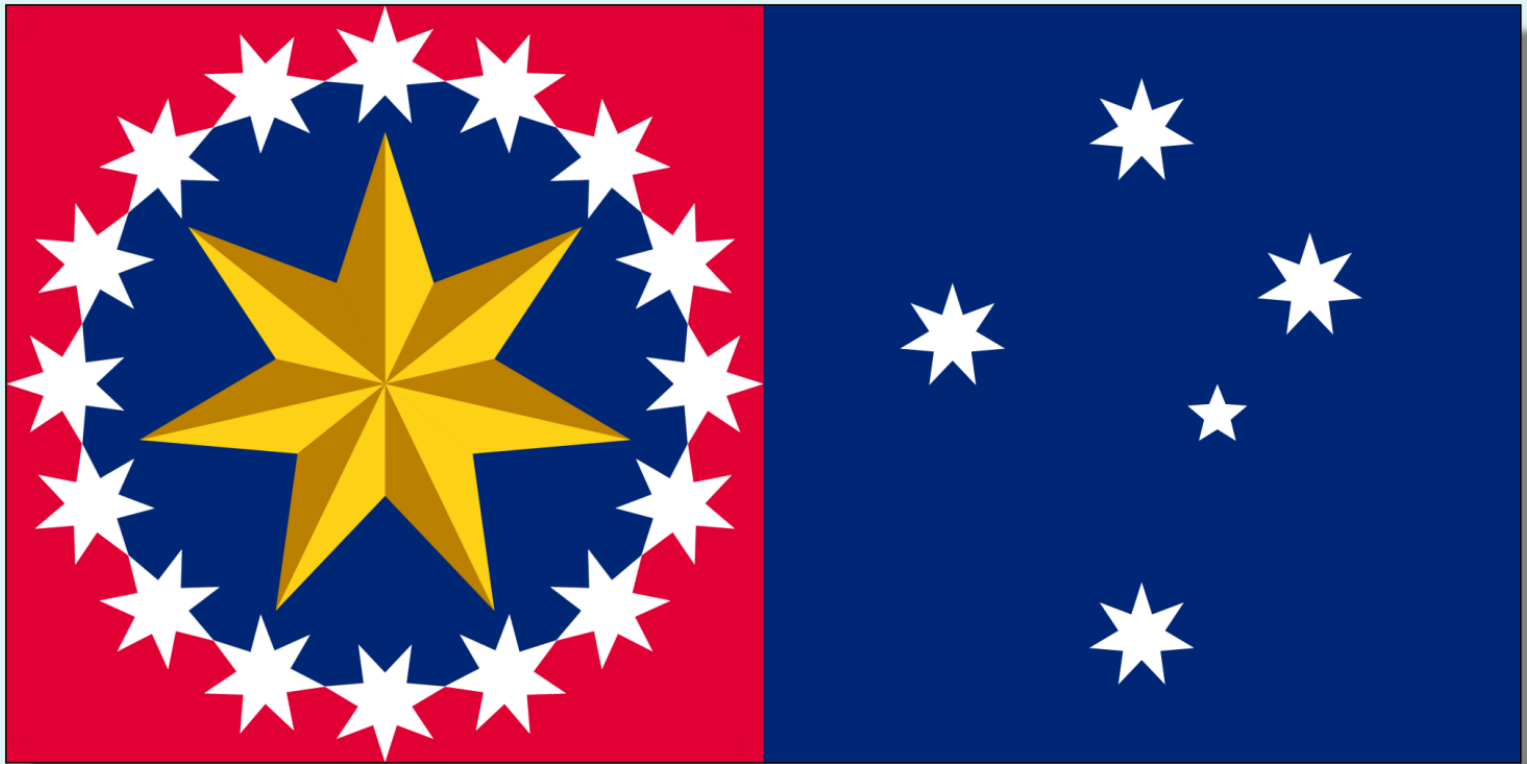


“Starstruck variant 5”, an alternative Australian national flag design (with suggested adaptations of the design to the other major flags and ensigns of the nation)

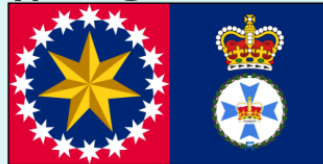

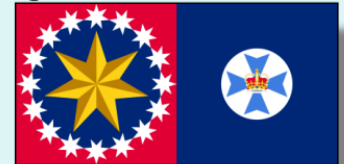

Superimposed on the red field of the hoist is a circular medallion of blue, which has been visually offset from the red by a ring of sixteen white stars, symbolising all of the states and territories of the Australian Commonwealth. Centred in the blue medallion is a gold Australian Commonwealth Star, given a 'raised' look by its two-tone treatment. For the fly of the national flag, a blue field is adorned with the white stars of the traditional Australian-style Southern Cross, whereas for the remaining flags and ensigns of the nation, the fly accommodates various other appropriate fields, patterns, and emblems, as illustrated above. The bold colours and distinctive patterns of this flag will ensure that it is instantly recognisable as that of Australia. A special 'banner' version of the flag, particularly suitable for use as a pall, can easily be derived as shown to the left.
